## **Conference Registration**

The Pennsylvania Department of Education's Title I State Parent Advisory Council (SPAC) conference is designed for Title I parents of school-aged children and administrators/staff who work with parents in education programs. This Annual Parent Conference includes keynote speakers, more than 40 individual workshops, award winning Kids Camp, and networking opportunities. Act 48 hours are available for educators and administrators attending the conference.

#### Registering to attend the event:

The conference has something for any parent interested in helping children or enhancing parent involvement in school. Using Title I funds to pay for Title I families to attend the conference is an allowable expense. If your LEA's Title I funding exceeds \$500,000, you will be responsible for paying for all attendees to attend the conference. Additional costs such as children's meals are legitimate Title I parent involvement expenditures, providing schools have allocated funding for this purpose.

If your LEA's Title I funding is less than \$500,000 SPAC will pay for one Title I parent designated by the district. Covered costs include two nights lodging, plus conference meals (2 breakfasts, 2 lunches, and 2 dinners).

Until May 1, 2018, LEA's can register only two parents (and their children, if applicable) to attend the SPAC conference in an effort to include as many LEAs as possible. There are two exceptions; the Philadelphia City School District can register 20 parents (plus children), and the Pittsburgh School District can register 10 parents (plus children) before the May 1, 2018 deadline.

Starting on May 2, 2018 an LEA can register additional Title I parents and children to attend as space permits.
